Title	Local Knowledge - Bushfire			
Purpose	To maximise the safety of incident response personnel and the safety of the community by integrating local knowledge into incident management teams.			
Scope	This Joint Standard Operating Procedure applies to all CFA, DEPI and MFB personnel engaged in integrated responses to bushfire.			
Content	This Joint Standard Operating Procedure outlines the need to integrate local knowledge in incident management teams.			
Responsibilities	Regional Controllers, Incident Controllers and Agency Commanders.			
Definitions	 Within this document, the following definitions apply: Agency commander: Agency operational supervisor operating within the agency chain-of-command. During an emergency response, agency commanders supervise and task their agency personnel in accordance with the direction of the controller at their respective tier. Control: The direction of response activities across all agencies responding to an emergency. Control operates horizontally across agencies. Incident Controller: The person accountable and responsible for the direction of response and support activities at an incident. Incident Management Team (IMT): The team assembled to assist the Incident Controller perform the control function, applied using the principles of the Australasian Inter-service Incident Management System (AIIMS). Local knowledge: The knowledge held by an individual or group of individuals familiar with the local geography, history and community in which an emergency event occurs Regional Controller: Agency personnel appointed by the EMC, acting on behalf of the EMC and rostered in each Region to exercise control over regional readiness and response to emergencies. Responder agencies: Country Fire Authority (CFA), Department of Environment and Primary Industries (DEPI), Metropolitan Fire Brigade (MFB) and Victoria State Emergency Service (VICSES).

S	1.	Regional Controllers and Regional Agency Commanders must ensure that readiness and rostering arrangements provide Incident Controllers with access to personnel with local knowledge. These personnel do not need to be members of the responder agencies.					
S O P	2.	2. The Incident Controller must ensure that as far as is practicable, personnel who are able to contribute a local perspective and have knowledge of local issues ar involved in the planning and conduct of incident response, including the provisio of warnings and advice to communities.
